

RESOLUTION 2021-63

EXTENDING THE DATES OF RESOLUTIONS 2021-30 AND 2021-36 RELATED TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE OPEN CONTAINER AREA AND DOWNTOWN ECONOMIC ENHANCEMENT INITIATIVES.

WHEREAS, in an effort to support our local downtown businesses and in response to business climate changes due to the worldwide pandemic and public health orders the Laramie City Council heard and approved Resolution 2021-30 establishing an open container district and Resolution 2021-36 approving certain initiatives in the downtown; and,

WHEREAS, those resolutions established an end date of the last Saturday in September, September 25, 2021, for the open container area and September 30, 2021 for the area known as “Hollyhock Commons;” and,

WHEREAS, the City received a request from the Laramie Main Street Alliance requesting consideration for these two initiatives to remain in place through the University of Wyoming’s Homecoming Week; and,

WHEREAS, the reasons that the Laramie Main Street Alliance is requesting these extensions are related to providing a complimentary role to planned homecoming activities and to provide enjoyment to alumni, students and visitors traveling to Laramie for the activities and that these two initiatives have seen immense use and praise from the public and district business owners.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF LARAMIE WYOMING, RESOLVES:

SECTION 1. That foregoing recitals are incorporated in and made part of this resolution by this reference.

SECTION 2. That the City Council supports extending the end date of Resolution 2021-30, establishing an open container area through October 23, 2021 and Resolution 2021-36, approving “Hollyhock Commons” through October 24, 2021.
