Background:

Pursuant to Chapter 41 of the State Loan and Investment Board’s rules, eligible entities may apply for ARPA grants for water and sewer projects. Any entity desiring to apply for a grant must complete an OSLI provided application in its entirety and submit it to the Office of State Lands and Investments by August 12, 2022. The application contains a required resolution and certification statement to be approved by the governing body and signed by the Mayor. After the close of the application period, the Board will consider applications at a special meeting and award grants at its discretion.

This project will continue the sanitary sewer improvements to the C-Line outfall line. Currently, this line has a bottleneck located between Canby St. and Ivinson Ave. that requires correction prior to the completion of the Ivinson upgrades. This project replaces the main in 6th Street between Canby Street and Ivinson Street.

Over the past decade, the City has been working to upsize and rehabilitate its sanitary sewer outfall lines. Collector lines feed into these lines and transport wastewater to the treatment plant, which are critical components of the overall wastewater infrastructure. The process of improving outfall lines must be performed in a certain sequence, based on Department of Environmental Quality regulations.

The C-line project is phased according to a mandated schedule to make improvements to the upstream collection system in the future. One of the City’s scheduled sanitary sewer improvements is on Ivinson Ave. due to a deficiency in the capacity and configuration of the existing infrastructure. Phase 1 was at 2nd and Hancock to 1st and Canby and has been completed. Phase 2 will occur at 6th Street between Canby and Ivinson. Phase 3 is a smaller improvement required on Ivinson Ave. between 6th and 9th Streets and is planned for the future.

Phase 2 was originally estimated at \$2,000,000 but a recent engineer’s estimate put construction at nearly \$3.5 million. This is an unfortunate trend we are seeing across the nation and is due to material chain supply issues as well as labor shortages.
