

**CITY OF LARAMIE, WYOMING
RESOLUTION 2020-56**

**RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE RULES FOR AN OPEN CONTAINER AREA IN THE DOWNTOWN
DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, on July 7, 2020, City Council adopted Resolution 2020-41 creating an open container area with dates that included July 16th through Labor Day, September 7, 2020 on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday between the hours of 11:00 am through 8:00 pm;

WHEREAS, this Open Container Area only permits the consumption of alcoholic beverages purchased under a valid liquor license or permit in the area designated in Attachment A: Downtown Open Container Area;

WHEREAS, no sales and services of alcoholic beverages are permitted without the issuance of an alcohol catering permit, malt beverage permit, or Right-of-Way Encroachment for business purposes;

WHEREAS, alcoholic beverages to be consumed in this area must be served in plastic cups or aluminum bottles;

WHEREAS, alcoholic beverages may only be consumed by those 21 years old and older. Open containers of alcohol are not permitted inside vehicles;

WHEREAS, waived all fees associated with open container permits for this event only.

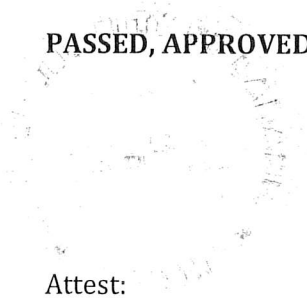
WHEREAS, open container area does not apply to Special Events. All necessary special event permits, alcohol catering, and malt beverage permits must be obtained for events described in Laramie Municipal Code 12.60.030.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LARAMIE, WYOMING, HEREBY RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the City Council extend the date of the Open Container Area in the Downtown District through September 30, 2020, between the hours of 11:00 am and 8:00 pm on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday each week.

Section 2. That this resolution would become effective upon passage.
