

Political Signs

Election season is here, giving community members an opportunity to support their favorite politicians by displaying their campaign signs. If you choose to do so, please remember that signs are only to be placed on private property and not within any City right-of-way. Per Wyoming State Statute 22-25-115: Written campaign advertising; prohibiting placement on public property; exception. Except as provided herein, written campaign advertising shall not be placed on or attached to any real or personal property of the state or its political subdivisions. This prohibition shall not apply to fairgrounds of the Wyoming state fair or of any county fair organized under the laws of this state. The University of Wyoming, any community college and school district may permit such advertising subject to regulation by their governing board as to time, place and manner. Any rules and regulations adopted shall provide for equal access to opposing political views. Subject to the approval of the landowner and any rules and regulations adopted by a municipality,

campaign materials may be placed on municipal street rights-of-way. The department of transportation shall allow campaign materials to be placed on a state right-of-way within a municipality to the same extent which the municipality allows campaign materials to be placed on municipal street rights-of-way. Nothing in this section shall apply to any interstate highway.

Per City of Laramie Municipal Code:

15.14.120.B.17: Signs - Definition: "Election sign" means a sign advertising a candidate for political office or a measure scheduled for election.

15.14.120.C.2.r: Signs - General Provisions - Exempt Signs: Election signs that do not exceed thirty-two square feet in sign display area and seven feet in sign height, and are not located in any public right-of-way;
